stronger that someone, somewhere has picked him up and taken him Of all the measures taken in the search, Mrs. Enget had more faith in the dogs than anything else. And as each dog lost the scent or be-

came tired and footsore, she placed her faith in another. Sheriff Martin Ryan who head ed a good portion of the search and checked every lead, said Friday, 'I just can't see how Laverr can be alive. I don't know what to think. We've checked and rechecked everything, but there is one area I'd like to check again. I'd like to work to the northeast of the area where the search was conducted last Saturday — the day of the big push — when dogs and men found tracks wandering in a zig-zag pattern about two miles north of the Enget farm. We were

going to work that area Sunday when the snow came. MARBLE IS CLUE

That was the area where the searchers found tracks. Light hairs, human, were found caught in a barbed wired fence. A marble was picked up near a weatherheaten farmhouse. Lavern was fond of carrying marbles and nails in his pockets. That is the area where sloughs, a half mile long, one after the other, extend across the broken land.
