

Find Body of Boy, 4, Missing for Year

POWERS LAKE, N. D. (AP)—The body of LaVerne Enget, 4, for whom an estimated 3000 men searched North Dakota prairie land a year ago, was found today in a slough one mile from his farm home. The body, in 10 inches of water,

was discovered by volunteers who met to make "one last search" for the youngster who wandered from his home Oct. 17, 1954. Sheriff Martin Ryan said he had no doubt the body found was that of LaVerne. The boy's father, Robert Enget, identified clothing on the body as that worn by LaVerne the day he disappeared.

Sheriff Ryan and State's Atty Burt Wilson took the body to Minot for examination by a pathologist, who will try to determine if the child drowned or died from some other cause. Vern Steele, assistant fire chief at the village of Grenora, found the body as he and other volunteers were preparing to pump the water from the slough. Fire departments from several small towns in northwestern North Dakota were pumping sloughs in the area of the Enget farm, and also were burning weeds that obscured the sloughs.

Arnold M. Brudvik, publisher of the Powers Lake Herald, weekly newspaper, recalled that in the hunt shortly over LaVerne's disappearance, he plodded through the same slough where the body was found. Hundreds of acres had been combed last year by National Guardsmen and volunteers.

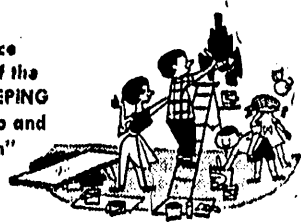
